1 Spelling	color (colour), freind (friend), kat (cat)
2 Sentence Structure	
2.1 Run-On Sentence	Frank loved his dog he was his best friend.
2.2 Fragment	When the sun came up.
2.3 Comma Splice	The candy was good, I want more.
2.4 Parallelism	I need you to wash the car, take out the garbage, buy some groceries, and getting your homework done.
2.5 Dangling Modifier	As he came around the corner, Jim smiled at Fred.
2.6 Mixed Construction	Most people who like to ride a bicycle, they need a good bicycle.
3 Punctuation	Susan loves to sit on the beach
4 Homonyms	They're, their, and there You're and your To, too, and two Where, were, wear, and we're Here and hear
